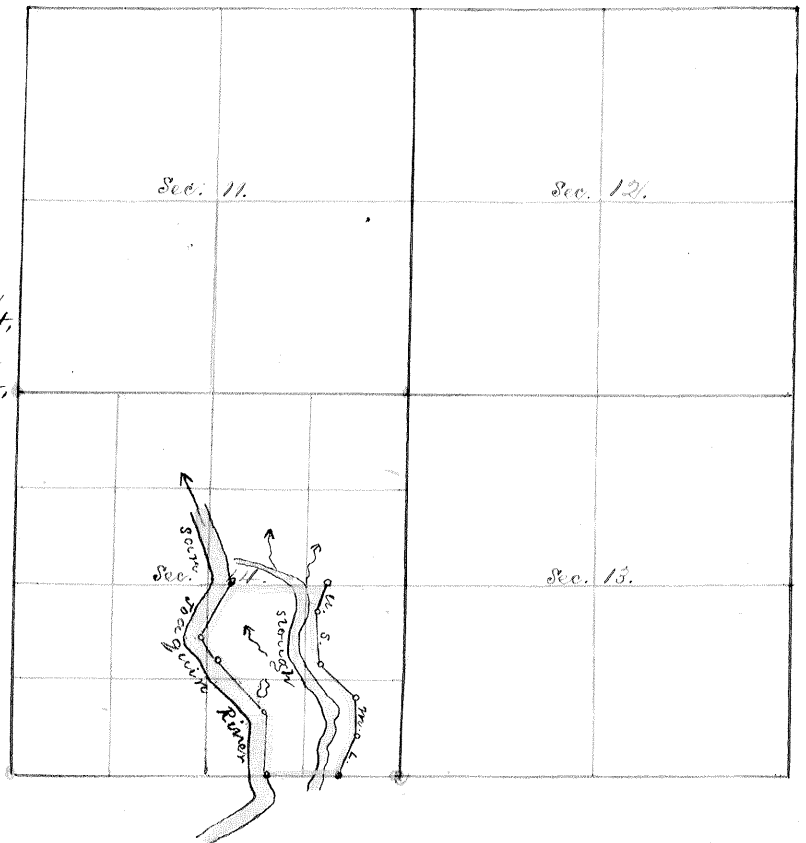

Field Notes

Beginning at the U. S. Meander Post on the East and West line between Sections 14 and 23, Township 4 South, Range 7 East, of Mt. Diablo Base and Meridian: Thence along the U. S. Meander Line in Sec. 14, down Stream:— N $28\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E 8.43 Chains, N 5° W 8.00 chs; N $43\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W 10.00 chs; N $79\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W 11.00 chs; N $22\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ E 7.00 chs. to a Post set at intersection with the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. line E. and W. in Sec. 14; Thence West 20.65 Chs. to a Blazed Willow 3 inches in diameter, standing on the right bank of the San Joaquin River; Thence Meander up Stream:— S 25° W 12.50 chs; S 26° E 6.00 chs; S 46° E 15.00 chs; South 12.85 chs. to a forked Willow standing at intersection with the Section line between Sections 14 and 23; Thence East 14.87 chs. to the point of beginning;

Run by the true Meridian: Magnetic Variation $15^{\circ} 45'$ East.

Surveyed in accordance with the Act of the Legislature Concerning State Lands, Approved April 27th 1863, and the instructions of the Surveyor General.
